

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends the following adult immunization schedule:

- **COVID:** Vaccination is recommended for everyone age 6 months and older.
- Flu: One dose every year.
- Pneumonia: Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV15 or PCV20) for all adults 65 years or older who have never received any pneumococcal conjugate vaccine or whose previous vaccination history is unknown.
- Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV): Adults 60 years and older should talk to their health care provider about whether the RSV vaccination is right for them. It is given as a single dose.
- **Shingles:** Two doses of Shingrix 2-6 months apart for adults age 50 or older regardless of past shingles episode or Zostavax vaccine.

These vaccines and their administration are covered at 100% if given by a network provider.

If the doctor provides any other services during your appointment, you may be responsible for an office co-pay.

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
